## JACK JOHNSON-DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD





## Mr. Jerry Lasceski

It is my distinct honor to present the Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award to a truly exceptional individual whose dedication, leadership, and passion have left an indelible mark on our community—Mr. Jerry Lasceski.

Jerry Lasceski's journey with Akron-Fairgrove Schools began in 1965, where he not only shaped young minds through his Business Education classes but also profoundly influenced the lives of countless student-athletes. For over four decades, Jerry's commitment to coaching was unwavering, spanning from 1965 to 2008 in Boys Varsity Track and Field and from 1970 to 2007 in Boys Cross Country. His remarkable tenure also included leading the Girls Cross Country program, with a notable hiatus between 1980 and 1988.

Jerry's accomplishments in coaching are nothing short of extraordinary. Under his guidance, the Boys Track and Field team amassed 12 conference championships and 6 regional titles. His leadership culminated in two state championships, in 1978 and 1993, and he was honored as the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association Coach of the Year in both 1978 and 1993. Additionally, Jerry's coaching prowess earned him the Michigan High School Athletic Association Coach of the Year award in 1978.

In Boys Cross Country, Jerry's teams achieved remarkable success, including 10 top-ten finishes at the state finals and a state championship in 1978. His dedication was recognized with the MITCA Coach of the Year award in 1978.

Jerry's impact extended to the Girls Cross Country team, where he guided them to seven top-ten finishes at the state finals and a state championship in 1991. His exceptional coaching earned him the MITCA Coach of the Year award in 1991, and he was later recognized as the MHSAA Coach of the Year and NFICA Section 4 Girls Cross Country Coach of the Year in 1998.

Beyond his coaching accolades, Jerry has been honored with the Thumb of Michigan Sports Leader Award in 1992 and the MITCA Ambrose Award, reflecting his deep commitment to the sport and his community. His contributions were further acknowledged with inductions into the Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame in 1998 and the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2016. In 2010, Akron-Fairgrove Jr./Sr. School dedicated their Track & Field in his name, a testament to his lasting legacy.

Jerry's service extends beyond the track and field. His contributions as MITCA Treasurer from 1993 to 2000, as a board trustee for the Tuscola County Community Foundation, and as the Treasurer of The Thumb Meet of Champions reflect his ongoing commitment to the sport and the community. Additionally, Jerry's role as a registered official for 49 years, his work as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion at St. Christopher Catholic Church, and his service in delivering home-delivered meals since his retirement further exemplify his dedication to service.

Tonight, we honor Jerry Lasceski not only for his extraordinary coaching achievements but also for his unwavering commitment to service and community. His legacy is a testament to the profound impact one individual can have through dedication, excellence, and a genuine love for others.

## Emphasis on Sportsmanship in High School Activities Now Extends to Online Behavior By Dr. Karissa Niehoff on August 03, 2022 NFH8

With the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country - and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way. As football, volleyball, soccer, field hockey and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs. Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years. Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that "each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship." In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court - or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall - sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities are helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens. And in today's online world dominated by hand-held devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever. At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontray of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field. In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online. As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that studentathletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening. In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online - honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online. At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams - particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person's life forever. Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student's chances for an athletic scholarship, but inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, posi-

tive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.





Ten (10) years of coaching outside of the state of Michigan may be applied to the application.

 Coaching at any level may be applied if it is a <u>school sponsored</u> interscholastic sport. A maximum of ten (10) years may be allowed for coaching at the collegiate level.

 To receive a <u>general</u> coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of <u>years</u>.

To receive <u>specific</u> certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of <u>years</u> in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys' and girls' basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is given to a person (or persons), either volunteer or staff, who have exhibited valuable professional service (within the MHSCA or among its association membership) including academically, supportive, service, assistance at any level of interscholastic athletics. These criteria are good measures of acceptable candidates and help to assure that recipients have a wide range of "service" that they provide to the profession of interscholastic athletics. Nominations should be submitted on an individual basis, not by a group or on behalf of constituent groups (conferences, affiliates, assemblies, committees, etc.).

The MHSCA Distinguished Service Award does not need to be awarded each year. This award should be bestowed only when the MHSCA Board of Directors committee decides that nominations warrant presentation of the award. This award may be given posthumously.

Why nominate a deserving candidate for the MHSCA Distinguished Service Awards:

- · To recognize a person who has positively impacted interscholastic athletics in a significant way.
- · To recognize institutions for their affiliation with individuals who demonstrate the highest level of professionalism and commitment to interscholastic athletics.
- · To confirm and honor a superior servant by his/her peers and colleagues.
- · To celebrate individuals who epitomize the profession's highest standards for interscholastic sports.
- To focus attention on the exemplary, and by doing so to elevate the profession overall and establish a high standard of
   excellence in promoting, supporting or contributing to interscholastic athletics.
